Skattum Dairy is a pasture-based dairy founded in the 1950's. Lily Andersen, an owner-operator, graduated from MSU with degrees in Animal Science and Livestock Management. Lily is committed to producing high-quality milk for the local community. "Last fall, our buyer told us 'I need more Montana milk.' I sat my family down and asked 'what do we need to grow?'

The operation currently milks about 40 cows and the investment from the Growth Through Agriculture award will allow the dairy to increase to 60 head. The award will be used to renovate the dairy's loafing shed and will not only increase stall capacity to accommodate their expanding dairy herd, but will also prioritize enhanced cow comfort, thereby fostering improved production outcomes.
