- Ranchers improve plant growth on rangelands by rotating cattle through a series of pastures.
- Guardian dogs, also known as working dogs, protect livestock from predators.
- Sheep will graze on forbs, including weeds, which makes room for more native plants.
- Goat nannies can have up to four young at a time, called kids.
- Ranchers depend on rangelands to provide grass forages for their cattle herds.
- Sheep are often found with a herder; someone who stays with the flock at all times.
- Healthy riparian areas have a lush growth of vegetation.
- The first stewards of the range were Native Americans.
- Montana rangelands provide recreational opportunities.
- Rangeland definition: Land that produces grass forbs and shrubs that can be eaten by grazing animals.
- Invasive species, such as spotted knapweed and leafy spurge, crowd out native rangeland plants.
- Bluebunch wheatgrass, the Montana state grass, is a perennial bunchgrass that grows in dry areas.
- Wildflowers, considered a forb, add beauty to Montana rangeland.
- Sage grouse will make their nests under sagebrush or grass stands and feed on sagebrush, insects, and other plants.
- Species of bees like this one, *Bombus huntii*, pollinate rangeland plants for reproduction.
- Meadowlarks, the Montana state bird, spend their summers and raise their fledglings on rangelands.
- Pronghorn antelope can sprint up to 60 miles per hour and live in herds on rangelands.
