



MDA Highlights SporeAttic Gourmet Mushroom Farm in Bozeman, Montana

Director Clark and representatives from the Montana Department of Agriculture (MDA) continued their focus on highlighting the diversity in Montana's agricultural ecosystem yesterday where they visited SporeAttic, a gourmet mushroom farm in Bozeman, Montana.

SporeAttic came to market in October of 2020. In the past three years, founder and owner Ben Deuling and has become known around the local community and beyond for his gourmet specialty mushrooms. Just a year after running the farm, SporeAttic was producing and selling up to 500 lbs. of mushrooms a week to local chefs, grocery stores, and at farmer's markets.

With focuses on efficiency, staff, and expansion, they have been able to produce nearly 1000 lbs. of mushrooms a week that are delivered to various customers around the Bozeman and Big Sky area.



“Mushroom farming is a very DIY venture,” said Deuling. *“We have been able to build an amazing community here in Bozeman that is so supportive which has encouraged our expansion.”* SporeAttic partnered with Three Hearts Farm to build their mushroom cultivation facility that has been crucial to their success.



Director Clark spoke with Deuling about future expansion plans, current bottlenecks, and the local appetite for these specialty gourmet mushrooms. *“We are consistently impressed with the ag innovation across Montana. From mushroom farmers to large conventional operations, Montana has a diverse agricultural ecosystem, and our producers of all kinds continue to push the envelope,”* said Director Clark.

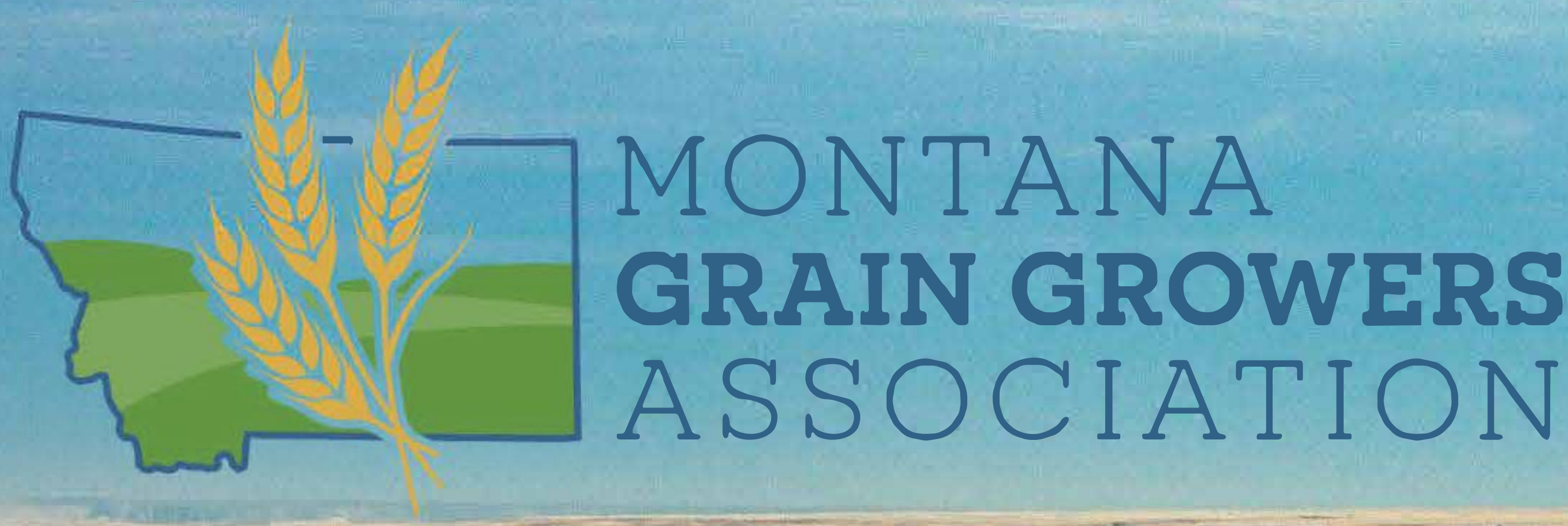

Through its AgEquipt Loan Closet, CFF connects producers with specialized, agricultural-specific adaptive equipment, like an Action Trackchair.

Lewis also hosts a podcast through the foundation, inviting farmers, ranchers, and veterans onto the podcast to share how they overcame a hardship, whether that be a farming accident or mental health struggle.

Montana Department of Agriculture Seeking Seasonal Potato Inspectors

The Montana Department of Agriculture is looking for seasonal potato inspectors interested in working with Agriculture Producers. These positions will begin working in Mid-February and work through May. Hours vary between 10 to 40 hours a week with mileage reimbursement for travel to the jobsite and return. Inspectors will be working outside in the weather with Montana farmers examining potato samples.

Inspector positions are available in Manhattan, Toston, Townsend, Dillon, Twin Bridges, Ronan, and Kalispell.

We like to get our “Drink of the Month” into different hands around the department.

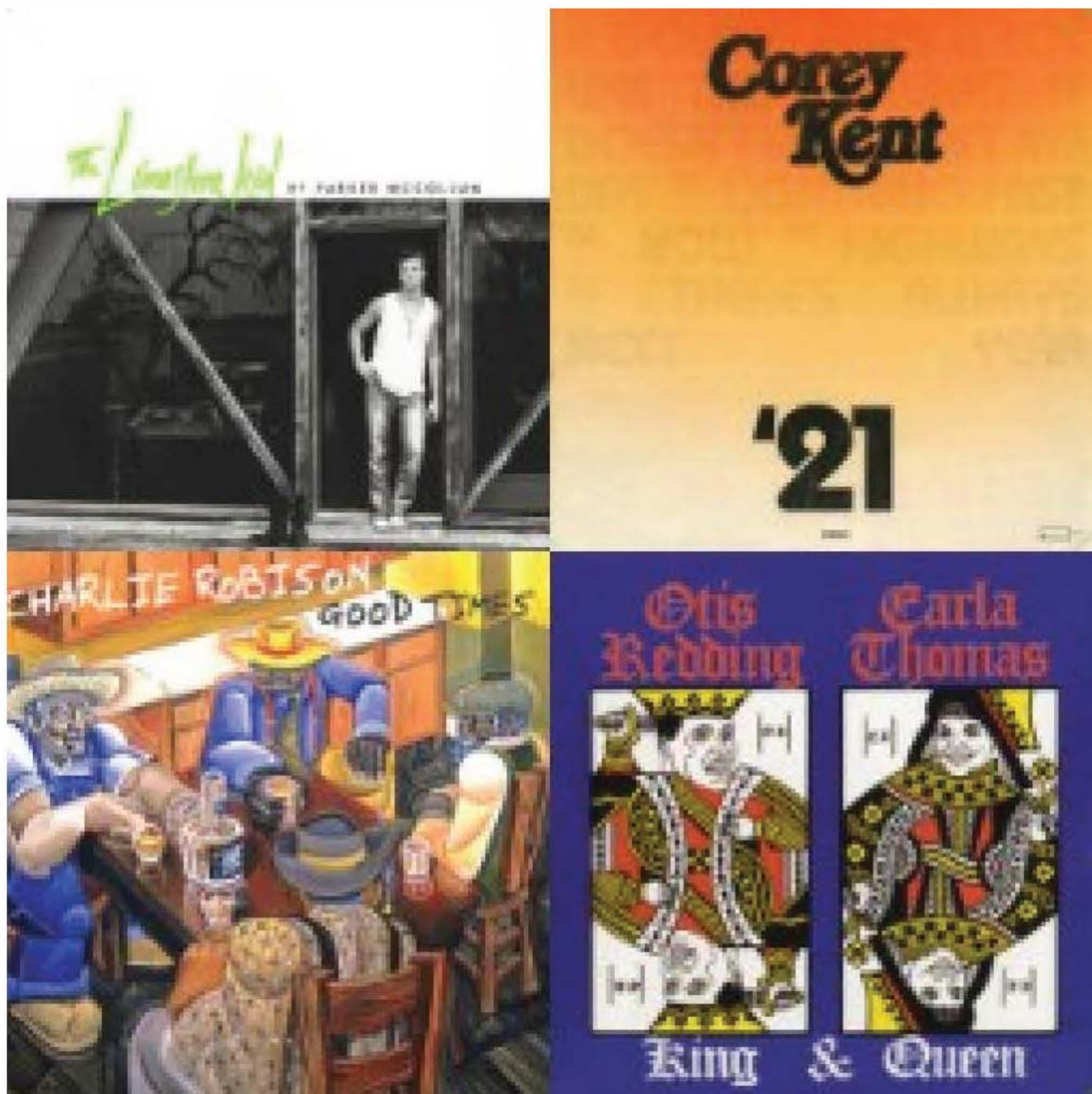
