10:25 – 11:15	Control of Vertebrates in Sensitive Areas <i>This presentation discusses the management of ground squirrels, pocket gophers, prairie dogs, and voles that occur in areas visible to neighbors and the public, such as parks, residential properties, golf courses etc. Topics include biology and abilities, their damage, disease, and sign of presence. The remainder of the presentation details the strategies to eliminate their presence from the landscape with attention on the pros and cons of techniques and their risks for public condemnation.
